Dear Friends,

June is the birth month of the famed author Harriet Beecher Stowe, who entered the world on June 14, 1811, in Litchfield, Connecticut. Stowe is of course most famous for her novel Uncle Tom's Cabin (1852), which was wildly successful and single-handedly helped build up abolitionist feelings in the North.



What many people don't know is that Stowe lived a fascinating life, she was born into one of nineteenth-century America's most important families, and she was highly religious. Her father was Lyman Beecher, a Presbyterian clergyman and a leader of America's Second Great Awakening (a religious revival in the early 1800s). Her brother was Henry Ward Beecher, a preacher who was instrumental in the anti-slavery movement (and who, by the way, was a pastor in Indianapolis for eight years). Her sister, Catherine Beecher, was an innovative educator and set up schools for women (and if you ever did calisthenics in school, well, that's because of her).

In 1832, Lyman Beecher became president of a seminary in Cincinnati, Ohio (your pastor's birthplace!), and Harriet moved to Cincinnati with her father. There, she encountered runaway slaves, frequently visited Kentucky and, separated from that slave state only by the river, she learned a great deal about slavery's actual effects on people and society. After 18 years in Ohio she moved to Maine, as her husband became a professor there. After her move she wrote her most famous novel, outlining the horrors of slavery in such vivid detail that, famously, Queen Victoria wept as she read the book.

In the nineteenth century, only one book outsold Uncle Tom's Cabin: the Bible. Harriet Beecher Stowe was a great writer and a learned intellectual. She was also a serious woman of faith, and it was her Christian belief system which led her to expose the evils of slavery to the world.

The women appreciated the help from the men who served the drinks and cleaned the kitchen.

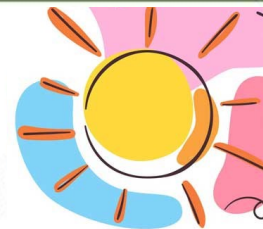

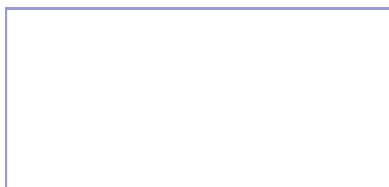

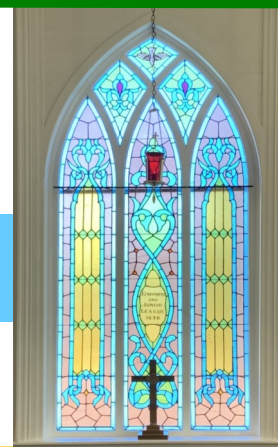
